



MOUNT DORA HISTORY

In 1845 Florida was admitted into the Union and it was in the 1850's that it was known that William and Dora Drawdy settled two miles south of Lake Dora. Government surveyors came to survey the area and were recipients of Dora Drawdy's hospitality. In 1910, in gratitude, they named Lake Dora in her honor. The David Simpson family were the first homesteaders in Mount Dora in 1874. Originally the town was named Royellou, an acronym for the names of the children of the first postmaster Ross Tremain - Roy, Ella and Louis. In 1882-1883 the name was changed to Mount Dora.



In 1886 the local newspaper, the Mount Dora Voice, stated factory, three hotels and two churches. And in 1887 the first

train arrived in Mount Dora. Growth was slow and the earliest industry, citrus, had a devastatingly blow when freezes descended in 1894 and again 1895, nearly wiping out the fledgling groves.

It was in 1893 that J.P. Donnelly, had built what we call the Donnelly House. Rumor has it that it was built as a wedding gift to his wife, Annie McDonald Stone. It is an example of Steamboat Gothic/Queen Anne architecture, and the most photographed house in Lake County. The Lakeside Inn was built in that year as well. John Alexander, Annie and J.P. Donnelly as well as John McDonald came together to get the project built to become the first hotel in Mount Dora. Guests over the years have included President and Mrs. Coolidge, Thomas Edison, Henry Ford and President Dwight Eisenhower. Both structures are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

In 1910 Mount Dora was incorporated and reportedly there were 371 people living in the town with 42 residing in the surrounding area. J. P. Donnelly is elected as the first mayor. And the first firehouse was built in 1923 and cells were added to also house the town's jail. It is now the Royellou museum.

In 1928 the Mount Dora Lawn Bowling Club was organized. It began with 3 hard packed sand rinks and 20 members. Eventually another 11 rinks were added and lights for night bowling. It is one of the largest Clubs in the US and attracts national and international lawn bowlers.



In 1929 the Community Building was built for \$35,000. Former President Coolidge and his wife Grace attended the dedication ceremony and planted a tree. In 2010 an expansion took place and the present lobby was added.

The First Art Festival was in 1975. Many other Festivals are now held in Mount Dora and the City is known as the City of Festivals.

In 2020 the first Jane Austen Fest is held!








SILENT AUCTION OF SPENCER JACKETS
